

Günther Dörzbacher, born on 20 September 1928 in Göppingen, died in 1949 in Erding

Günther Dörzbacher was the third child of Hulda, née Dörzbacher and Heinrich Dörzbacher. His sister, who was four years older, was called Ruth, and his brother Karl Rolf, who was five years older. Günther's father ran a flourishing cattle trade in the family-owned house at Geislinger Str. 8 until the Nazi administration revoked his licence in 1937.

Günther had probably attended the state Evangelische Knabenschule (Protestant Boys' School) from 1934 to 1936, until it was transformed into the racially oriented 'German School'. Günther was at the Jewish School until his escape to England on September 15, 1939 (presumably as part of a 'Kindertransport'). In 1942, his parents, who had fled to the USA in 1940, took him to live with them. His father had been interned in the Dachau concentration camp in 1938 and in the Welzheim concentration camp in 1939.

Günther Dörzbacher (**Gary Dorzback**) died as an American soldier in an accident in Erding in 1949.
